Biographical note

Sarah Frances Smiley (-1917) was born in Vassalboro, ME. She was brought among Quakers, became convinced, and joined Friends at an unknown date. In 1866, she was recorded a minister. Smiley wrote an evangelical essay, "Who is He? An appeal to those who regard with any doubt the name of Jesus. . ." in 1868. She withdrew from Friends, resigned her membership, and received water baptism in New York in 1872, though she did not join another denomination. Sarah Frances Smiley died at about 87, in 1917.
